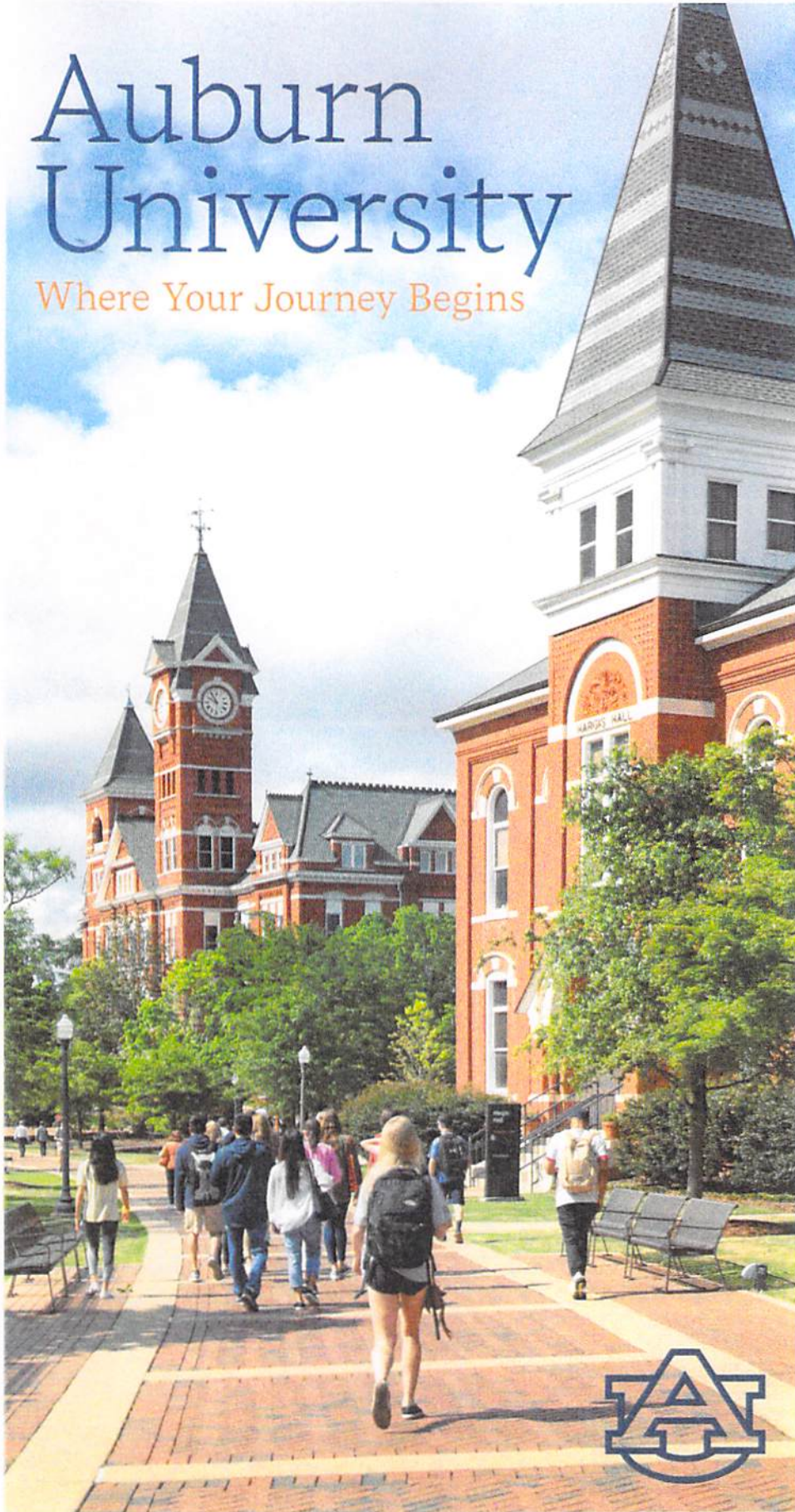

- \$50 application fee/\$60 International
- Official ACT and/or SAT test scores
Official test scores must be directly sent to Auburn University from the testing agency. We are unable to accept test scores posted on high school transcripts.

- Official high school transcript
Auburn University will recalculate a GPA if not provided on a 4.0 scale.

December 15	Freshman scholarship deadline Incoming freshmen accepted for admission must complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by 4:45 pm CST to receive consideration for all scholarships. FAFSA deadline for need-based scholarship consideration Need-based scholarships may be awarded to incoming freshmen beginning in January, requiring the FAFSA to be received by this date for maximum scholarship consideration. Students selected for FAFSA verification will not be eligible for financial aid, including need-based scholarships, if that process is incomplete.
February 1	Department scholarship deadline Financial aid priority deadline The FAFSA should be received by this date to receive financial aid priority consideration.
February 3	Regular application deadline All application files must be complete by this date for admission consideration.
March 2	Regular admission decisions released If the freshman class has reached capacity as of this date, students may be waitlisted for admission.
May 1	Enrollment deposit deadline Make final decision and submit \$250 non-refundable enrollment deposit to secure your spot. Scholarship response deadline

* The FAFSA is the only form a student is required to complete to be considered for student assistance from any of the Title IV HEA programs, except for information needed to ensure the student's eligibility for such assistance (e.g., information needed to complete verification or to demonstrate compliance with the student eligibility provisions of the HEA and the regulations). Auburn is proud to award a number of scholarships to students each year. Incoming freshmen with a minimum 3.5 high school GPA and a minimum 26 ACT score or equivalent SAT score as of the freshman scholarship deadline are more likely to receive a four-year merit scholarship based on academic achievement. The charts below provide estimated award amounts.

Additionally, general and departmental scholarships are awarded to incoming and current students by various units on campus, including academic colleges and schools.

Transfer Application

Transfer Freshman Application

Transfer freshmen are students with fewer than 30 completed semester hours

- Online application
- \$50 application fee /\$60 international
- Official high school transcript
- Scores from the American College Test (ACT) or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT)
- Official transcript from every postsecondary institution (college or university) attended

Transfer Application

Transfers are students with 30 or more completed semester hours

- Online application
- \$50 application fee/\$60 international
- Official transcript from every postsecondary institution (college or university) attended
- At least three semesters or equivalent quarter hours in each of the following areas:
 - English
 - History
 - Mathematics
 - Natural science with laboratory

GPA Requirements

To be considered for admission, students interested in transferring to Auburn University must earn a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale on all college work attempted (minimum 2.8 for College of Architecture, Design and Construction). Technical, remedial or vocational classes are not considered in the overall GPA. Auburn does not honor academic bankruptcies or forgiveness policies of other institutions. If a student has repeated a course to obtain a higher grade, both the old and new grade will be factored into the cumulative GPA.

Applicants must also be in good standing at all institutions previously attended.
